Goal:

The goal of the Parent/Family/Community Engagement District Plan:

- Create a foundation for mutual partners to collaborate and work together for the success of the child

Purpose:

The purpose of the Parent/Family/Community Engagement District Plan is:

- Support Parent Involvement Specialists in developing and maintaining a school's parent/family/community engagement plan.
- Create a common vision of parent, family, and community engagement and resources needed to sustain that vision
- Increase and improve the level of family engagement/involvement in Dothan City Schools.

Component 1: Family-to-Family Support

The following strategies will be required by the school's Parent Involvement Specialist and appointed district director to facilitate in each school:

- 1. Orientation during the initial days of each school year that creates a welcoming space for parents to gather and talk informally with one another.
- 2. "Meet the Teacher"- event facilitating family to family interactions (Open House)
- 3. "Celebrate Month"- Month-long celebration of the students in the school that have received awards throughout the community.

Component 3: Family Participation/Decision Making

The following strategies will be required by the school's Parent Involvement Specialist and appointed district director to facilitate in each school:

- 1. Campus Site-Based Decision-Making Committee composed of campus staff, community partners, parents, and business representatives focusing on planning, curriculum, budgeting, staff development, overall school organization, all with the intent of improving the achievement of all learners at the campus.
- 2. Share strategies with parents on how to advocate for themselves and their children appropriately.

3. Analyze family enrollment information so educators can learn about the children in their classrooms from their parents' perspective and begin mutual goal setting with each family.

Component 2: Network Community Resources

The following strategies will be required by the school's Parent Involvement Specialist and appointed district director to facilitate in each school:

- 1. Establish business partnership to develop "school adoption" program.
- 2. Partnership between school counselors for "Resource Fair" program Establish and facilitate with community resources to partner with parents and families to learn what resources invited organizations can provide (e.g. mental health, physical health, employment resources, human resources).
- 3. Presentation to local area Chamber of Commerce Share with local business leaders methods their organization can partner with local schools.
- 4. Establish the school's **Parent Resource Center** Contain information and resources to improve communication among parents, school and community.

Component 4: Developing School Staff Skills

The following strategies will be required by the school's Parent Involvement Specialist and appointed district director to facilitate in each school:

- 1. Support teacher in developing educator skills to support and use culturally diverse, culturally relevant, and culturally responsive family engagement strategies.
- 2. Promoting and developing family engagement as a core strategy to improve teaching and learning among all educators and staff.
- 3. Teachers and the school's Parent Involvement Specialist will brainstorm and actively seek out methods parents can participate/volunteer within the classroom.
- 4. Train educators about the resources that are available in the community that support families' interests and needs.

Component 5: Evaluating Parent/Family/Community Engagement Plan

The following strategies will be required by the school's Parent Involvement Specialist and appointed district director to facilitate in each school:

- 1. Parent surveys will gain information on preferences of program components and parents' perception of program effectiveness. Survey results serve to improve program design and to increase parent outreach and involvement.
- 2. Incorporating goals related to family engagement into the program/campus strategic planning initiatives.
- 3. Using parents as equal partners with staff in reviewing family engagement results and making decisions regarding plans for continuous improvement.
