SPANISH

Practice greeting your family members daily in Spanish.

“Hola.” = Hey.

“Buenos días.” = Good morning.

Introduce yourself with “Me llamo_____.” (My name is _____).

Ask them “¿Cómo te llamas?” (What’s your name?).

Ask them “¿Cómo estás?” (How are you?).

Responses can include:

“Bien.” 🖥️

“Mal.” 🤒

“Más o menos.” or “Así así.” = Okay.

With paper or sticky notes and your parent’s permission, label each of the following items or rooms in your house:
